Applications are due November 1 and March 1. **Deadline extended this year to March 22, 2024.**

TRANSCRIPT

Applicants must submit an unofficial copy of their University of Pittsburgh transcript. (Transfer students should also include transcript(s) from their previous institution(s).)

PROJECT PROPOSAL

Applicants must submit a one-page project proposal describing the project and its proposed goals and outcomes, a plan for its completion, and how the Fellowship's funding would help further this plan, with particular emphasis on how the project contributes to university or departmental diversity, equity, and inclusion goals.

PROPOSED BUDGET

Applicants must submit a one-page itemized budget indicating as precisely as possible at this stage how their requested funds (up to \$2000) would be spent.

FACULTY SUPERVISOR

Each applicant must obtain a supervisor from among the permanent Classics faculty, who will advocate for the project during the fellowship selection process, advise in the planning and development of the project itself, and give a review of the project upon its completion. No formal letter is required.
