TRANSCRIPT

Applicants must submit an unofficial copy of their University of Pittsburgh transcript. (Transfer students should also include transcript(s) from their previous institution(s).)

PROJECT PROPOSAL

Applicants must submit a one-page project proposal describing the proposed research topic and how it will relate to the Honors Thesis, a plan for the project's completion, and how the Fellowship's funding would help further this plan.

PROPOSED BUDGET

Applicants must submit a one-page itemized budget indicating as precisely as possible at this stage how their requested funds (up to \$1500) would be spent.

FACULTY SUPERVISOR

Each applicant must obtain a supervisor from among the permanent Classics faculty, who will advocate for the project during the fellowship selection process, advise in the planning and writing of the thesis itself, and arrange for its submission upon completion. No formal letter is required.
