

# Travel Fellowship Application

## Department of Classics, University of Pittsburgh

Classics majors in both tracks with a GPA (in the major) of 3.75 or above may apply for grants up to \$2500 to offset the cost of study abroad or travel related to their work in Classics. Preference will be given by seniority to students who have completed appropriate coursework in the department and who are applying for matching funds for a relevant program to which they have been accepted. Grant recipients may apply in successive years or for multiple grants in the same year up to the \$2500 maximum. Applications due November 1 and March 1.

### PROPOSED BUDGET

Applicants must submit a one-page itemized budget detailing the total cost of their chosen program of study or travel and indicating how their requested funds (up to \$2500) would be spent.

### FACULTY SPONSOR

Each applicant must obtain a sponsor from among the Classics faculty, who may be asked to advocate for the student during the fellowship selection process. No formal letter is required.
